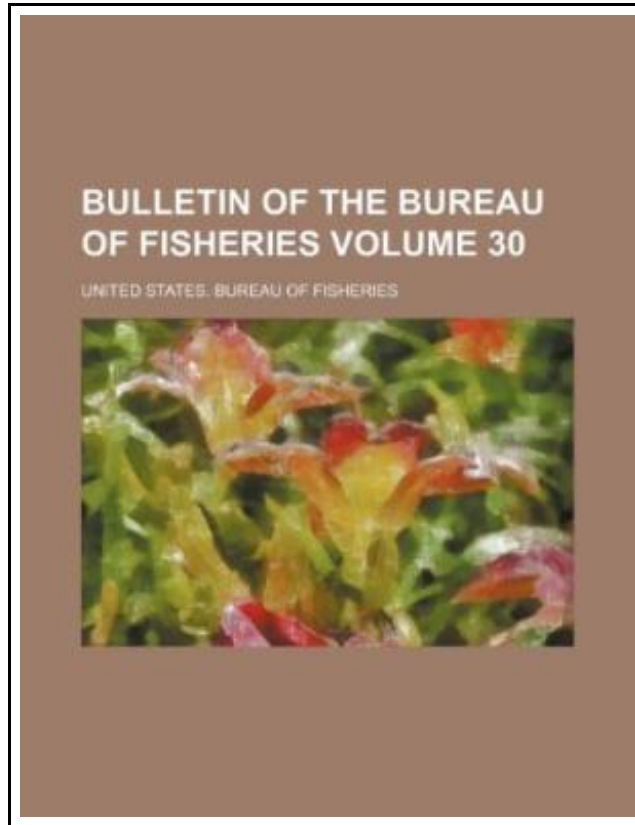

A number of short papers and references to New England Bryozoa are found in the literature of the subject, but in nearly all cases these are buried in reports dealing with other groups, and hence are not readily accessible and are easily overlooked. The first of these to appear, and the first to be published in America as well, was a short list by Desor (1848) of species observed by him in the region of Nantucket. This paper is chiefly interesting because it contains the original descriptions of two of our most characteristic species, *Bugula turrita* and *Membranipora tenuis*. In...
