Kerr & Company began in 1886 as a publisher of Unitarian tracts. The company's focus changed after its founder, the son of abolitionist activists, became a socialist at the turn of the century. Tracing Kerr's political development and commitment to radical social change, *We Called Each Other Comrade* also tells the story of the difficulties of exercising the First Amendment in an often-hostile business and political climate.
